November 1, 2019 Miami Beach Board of Adjustment: This is Miami Beach United's Resolution

An application has been filed regarding the calculation of floor area and/or "floor area ratio" (F.A.R.) pursuant to the Land Development Regulations - ZBA19-0097: 500 Alton Road

Executive summary:

The Developer of the 500 Alton project, which was just approved in December 2018 as a 519-foot, 44-story tower on the 500 block of Alton Road, is appealing the definition of density which governs the way the City of Miami Beach calculates all density for all development projects. Any change would improperly add enormous F.A.R. to this project and every project in the city.

Why It Matters

- This calculation, known as Floor Area Ratio, or F.A.R., would affect every project in development now and in the future by excluding things like stairwells and elevator shafts, etc.
- This calculation, if changed, would affect any new development in Town Center in North Beach, or in South of Fifth, or in any and every neighborhood in Miami Beach where a new project might be planned.
- The City Planning department has strongly recommended against making any changes to the calculation of F.A.R.
- Any recalculation of F.A.R. is, by decree of the City Charter, subject to a voter referendum and therefore shall not be handled in any other manner.

Miami Beach United strongly OPPOSES this appeal to change the way F.A.R. is calculated.

Miami Beach United 2019 Commission Scorecard

Tracks Commission Votes To Show How Resident-Friendly the City Of Miami Beach Elected Officials Are

Miami Beach United, the only community-based non-profit organization providing Miami Beach residents a cohesive voice for residents' rights and city-wide issues which impact their quality of life, is pleased to present its Second Annual Commission Scorecard covering the 2018-2019 fiscal year.

This is not a comprehensive review of the voting record of each elected official; it is merely an accounting of how each elected official voted on matters upon which Miami Beach United submitted a resolution to the Commission.

Here's how it works:

Each month, Miami Beach United identifies and tracks issues pertaining to residents rights and quality of life issues that are coming before the Commission. Many of these issues become resolutions, voted on by the Board of Directors, and shared in advance of the monthly Commission meetings with the Mayor and Commissioners (and staff) of the city of Miami Beach. They are also shared with all of you via this mailing list for Miami Beach United.

In each case, whenever Miami Beach United passed a resolution on a matter before the Commission, the scorecard indicates whether or not an individual elected official supported or opposed the action recommended by Miami Beach United. This scorecard ONLY reflects the items upon which MBU took a position, and therefore is not a representation of an elected official's complete voting record.

For ordinances, which require two hearings, only the final vote on Second Reading was recorded and counted. In some cases, when Miami Beach United's recommendations were only partially implemented.

that was treated as a neutral action, and that vote was excluded from the total score.

All items were weighted equally when calculating an overall percentage grade for each elected official during the measurement period.

This Commission Scorecard process commenced for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year with the November 2018 Commission meeting, with the final scorecard to be published after the October 17 2019 Commission meeting.

The Commission Scorecard process for the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year will commence with the October 30 2019 Commission meeting, with the final scorecard to be published after the final October 2020 Commission meeting.
